Lenten Musings

"God does not always provide explanations for your difficulties, but He does provide the promises of His Word." – Warren W. Wiersbe

Lent marks the ideal opportunity for us to examine our lives a little more closely than we usually do. This isn't (or shouldn't be)

something that scares us nor makes us feel that we are worth less. It may make us feel uncomfortable, but only because we come to see how our choices have drifted us away from the space God wants for us.

In the New Living Translation which we use in St Stephen's the word LOVE appears 759 times, more so than in other translations (NIV = 686, ESV = 684) according to biblestudytools.com. In John 3: 16 we read of how God loves the world so much that He gave His one and only Son, to save the world. God has proven throughout human history that He loves us more than life itself. Our response to that love in our daily walk with the Lord is what we focus on more closely during Lent.

I am often asked what made me leave South Africa and come all the way to Guernsey. When I read about the people of St Stephen's in the advert I saw in the Church Times, my heart was stirred by God to respond. What I have discovered in my time here (six months – so I'm no expert by any means) is the most wonderful community, people who have reached out to me and helped make the adjustment so much easier. My thanks to you all for the wonderful love that you have shown to me, and to my precious family.

This community has been through a great deal in the past few years. The interregnum was long and we also faced the passing of two of the parish stalwarts who had been guiding the ship through their ministry. My prayer for each one of us this Lent is that we would take the courage to find a quiet space and to reflect on our journey, not with a sense of foreboding or fear, but with an open heart to recognise the Hand of God at work in our lives. May this journey bring us ever closer to the Heart of God and enable us to realise that He is always with us, and His love for each one of us will never change.

May this Season of Lent give us an attitude of gratitude as we journey to Calvary... and beyond in the loving presence of Almighty God.

May God bless you and keep you close to His heart.

Really Reliable Recipes South African Melktert (Milk Tart)

This milk tart recipe is a traditional South African tart that is easy to prepare and can be served hot or cold.

Prep Time: 20 mins Cook Time: 50 mins Total Time: 1 hr 10 mins

Ingredients

- cooking spray
- 1 cup white sugar
- 3 tablespoons butter, melted
- 3 egg yolks
- 1 cup cake flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 4 cups milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 egg white
- 1 tablespoon cinnamon sugar

Directions

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Coat a 9-inch deepdish pie plate with cooking spray.

Mix together sugar and butter in a large bowl until smooth. Add egg yolks and beat until light and fluffy. Sift in cake flour, baking powder, and salt; stir until well-blended. Mix in milk and vanilla until combined.

Whip egg whites with an electric mixer in a separate bowl to stiff peaks. Fold into batter. Pour into the prepared pie plate; sprinkle cinnamon sugar on top.

Bake in the preheated oven for 25 minutes, then reduce temperature to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C). Continue baking until the center is set when pie is gently jiggled, 25 to 30 minutes.

What if we used it to receive messages from the text?


What if we treated it like we couldn't live without it?
