Greetings from St. Stephen's vicarage and the first parish magazine letter I have written in over three years. A strange feeling, given that I knew my audience well over the thirty-seven years I was vicar of Holy Trinity in Burslem, Stoke on Trent. For good or ill, it did become a bit of a rant against 1) the Church of England 2) General



Synod 3) British politics 4) various bishops – and anything that came out of the mouth of the BBC. I was told that people couldn't wait for the latest tirade. (Sadly, Woke hadn't taken off then so I could have ended up having my house burnt down.)

Perhaps I could tell you a little about my old parish. Working class, multi -racial (although a white highlands around the church), adjacent to Port Vale Football Club, Home of Robbie Williams and Royal Doulton until both left the area. Rather like St. Stephen's it was a pioneer Anglo-Catholic church, Anglo - Catholicism was a movement in the Church of England which sought to restore the catholic faith as enshrined in the formularies and liturgies of the Established Church. It was called the Oxford Movement because Oxford clerics began preaching and teaching what the Church of England believed but had stopped teaching. For example, the Holy Communion was central to the Book of Common Prayer (BCP) but Mattins and Evensong were the regular fare. The Church's Calendar of holy days and saints days to be observed were largely ignored. Sacramental Confession, taught in several places in the BCP, was also ignored. Such was the success of the Oxford Movement that clergy began to gain confidence in their priestly ministry and to rediscover what had been abandoned. Inevitably, there was a backlash and clergy were sent to prison or suspended because of, for example, mixing water with the wine in the chalice, putting lighted candles on the holy table, wearing vestments, advertising times for confession etc.

I wrote in the last paragraph that Anglo— Catholicism <u>was</u> a movement. By that I mean that it intended to restore sacramental Catholicism to the whole of the Church of England. To some extent there was great success. Any church which possesses a cross or crucifix, candles, a regular celebration of holy communion and other signs and practices owes its origin to the catholic movement. However, the acceleration of (largely American) evangelicalism has meant that the holy communion (and, indeed, Anglican worship) is now being replaced by what some consider to be endless choruses and emotionalism. (Oh dear! Rant

mode has switched on. Back to calm.) The ordination of women to the priesthood has also caused a separation between the majority of Anglo-Catholic churches and the rest of the CofE.

Back to Holy Trinity Burslem. Having had a moan about modern evangelical worship, I have to admit that certain aspects had an effect on worship over the years, largely because of pilgrimages to the Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham in Norfolk. We introduced a number of choruses and modern songs, a power point projector, a westward-facing altar, slightly less formal eucharistic worship, alongside all the traditional catholic "privileges". Above all, the objective presence of Our Lord in the eucharistic bread was paramount. (Made very clear in St. Stephen's with the aumbry in the Lady Chapel and the white lamp burning perpetually. We genuflect in honour of that sacramental presence.

It says somewhere in Holy Writ about "bringing out from the storeroom things both old and new". This is what I believe that we should be doing in our worship. Drawing from the great store of liturgical music and hymnody throughout the ages in order to enhance our offering of worship and engagement with it. I do, however, realise that I am a child of the 50s/60s. Young Anglo - Catholic clergy seem to be far more conservative and traditional so it could be me who is old-fashioned. We are always of our time while Christ, as Holy Writ tells us, is "Yesterday, Today, and Forever."

May our desire always be, however it is done, to offer worship to the Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit, and in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Verse 2 - Thank you Lord for Charles our King


Verse 3 - Thank you Lord for family
